

Spring 2019 Humanities / Social Science (HU/SS) Electives at the School of Engineering

Courses that fulfill the hu/ss requirement are listed under these prefixes: AH, CAM, EN, HI, MD, PL, PS, SEG, STS, and URB. The minimum requirement for most majors is 24 units (6, 4-credit courses). Two of these are the first-year writing courses (EXPOS-UA 1 and 2, or EXPOS-UA 4 and 9). The rest are hu/ss electives. One elective must be writing intensive, and one must be at the 3000 or 4000 level (this may be the same course or two different courses).

Outside of the School of Engineering: Courses may be used to fulfill the hu/ss requirement if they are in a field of the humanities (such as art history, literature, history, philosophy) or social sciences (such as anthropology, psychology, media studies, or sociology). Courses outside of the School of Engineering do not complement an engineering education in the same way as the courses do from TCS, but they can be used nonetheless. Note that the hu/ss requirement may not generally be fulfilled by a course that teaches a skill (such as introductory language courses, learning to play musical instruments, creating artwork, creative writing). A list of courses from other schools of NYU that are preapproved for the School of Engineering hu/ss requirement is available online on the Department of Technology, Culture and Society's webpage (General Education Cluster hyperlink).
